


# ROCHDALE EVANGELICAL CHURCH



## Prayer Letter 10 – February 2022

*For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost.' (Lk. 19:10 NIVUK)*

### News Update!

Apologies for the length between prayer letters. It has been a very busy time for us both as a family and as a church.

### Outreach

We had an encouraging start to the Christmas period with over 40 people coming to an all-age outreach we did called “The Adventure of Christmas.” However, like everyone else, the re-implementation of restrictions slowed things down for us around Christmas itself.

Since Christmas various people have showed interest in coming along. Some have come through leaflets delivered in the local area. Other have come through personal links with people in the church.

Our church Bible verse for the year is Luke 19:10, which reminds us that the very reason Jesus came was to seek and save the lost and we pray that he will continue that work through us in Rochdale.



### Discipleship

We have been studying Luke together in both our Sunday meetings and our Growth Group with the aim of grounding us again in the good news of Jesus our Saviour King. We have even had our first visiting speaker (Jim Campbell from Oldham Bethel Church)

Our Growth Groups are back on Zoom due to COVID restrictions and then space restrictions. Hopefully, we might be able to restart in-person some time around Easter.

As there are a number of people who are free during the day at the church, we have also started a regular Friday morning Zoom meeting. We follow a four week pattern:

1. Book Group (we're reading *I Am A Church Member* by Thom Rainer)
2. Prayer Meeting
3. Evangelism Training (using some of the *Passion for Life* material)
4. Prayer Meeting

### Forming the Church

We have now formed a membership and begun to have members' meetings as we move towards formally forming our church plant as a church with a CIO (a kind of charity). The FIEC support us in doing this with their linked solicitors.

## COVID-19

As a family, like many others in the last couple of months, COVID-19 finally caught up with us. We have had a couple of periods of self-isolation since Christmas with two of us testing positive at different times, although thankfully without serious symptoms.

This has been mirrored in the church with a good number of people testing positive since Christmas, which has put some strain on us keeping going (we've had a couple of Zoom-only Sundays). Small churches struggle when only a few people are missing!

Hopefully we're moving to a more normal setup now!
